

The Trisagion. The cantor sings once through, then all sing twice.

Almighty and everlasting God, your Son Jesus Christ healed the sick and restored them to fullness of life. Look with compassion on the suffering throughout the world, and by your power make whole all peoples and nations; through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

A Reading from the Second Book of Kings

Our first reading is the story of the cure of Naaman from his leprosy. Naaman, commander of the army of Syria, first refuses to trust what Elisha tells him to do, but then he is healed and accepts the power of God to save.

Naaman, commander of the king of Aram's army, was a great man and highly esteemed by his master. He was a mighty warrior, but he suffered from leprosy. Now Naaman's wife was served by a young girl from Israel, who had been taken captive by the Arameans, and who knew of the healing power of Elisha the prophet. The girl said to her mistress, "If only my master could meet the prophet who lives in Samaria, he would cure him of the leprosy." Hearing this from his wife, Naaman went and asked the king for leave to visit Israel. The king granted his request and sent him off with this message: 'King of Israel, I have sent to you my servant Naaman, and I beg you to cure him of his leprosy.'

So Naaman set off, taking with him horses, chariots filled with gold and silver, and ten changes of clothing. The king of Israel read the letter and was suspicious that this was a trap. 'My enemy sends this fellow to me to be cured of his disease? They are trying to pick a quarrel with me.' But when Elisha heard of Namaan and the request to heal him, he said, "Let the man come to me, and he will soon know that there is truly a prophet in Israel."

Naaman, with his horses, and chariots filled with gold and silver, and ten changes of clothing, arrived at Elisha's house; but the prophet didn't come out. He sent a note to Naaman, which read, 'If you go and wash seven times in the River Jordan, your flesh will be restored and you will be clean.'

Naaman was furious and sputtered, "He could have at least come out, invoked his God by name, waved his hand, and cured me right away. And I could have stayed home and washed myself in the Damascus River, if that's all it takes." He stormed off in a rage. One of his servants confronted him. "If Elisha had told you to do something difficult, would you have said no? If you wash, you will be clean. Why not try what he tells you to do?"

Reluctantly, Naaman went and washed in the Jordan seven times, as he had been told. His flesh was restored like a little child's, and he was clean. He went back to Elisha, the man of God, and confessed, "Now I know that there is no god anywhere in the world except in Israel. In thanks and gratitude, I want to pay you for healing me". Elisha replied, "The Lord lives, and because I serve God, I need no payment. Return to your country, and go in peace."

The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Psalm 111 is an outpouring of praise for the majesty and graciousness of the Lord. The cantor sings the refrain, and then all sing as indicated.



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Hallelujah! I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart, in the assembly of the upright, in the congregation.

Great are the deeds of the Lord! They are studied by all who delight in them. R.

His work is full of majesty and splendor, and his righteousness endures for ever.

He makes his marvelous works to be remembered; the Lord is gracious and full of compassion. R.

The works of his hands are faithfulness and justice; all his commandments are sure.

They stand fast for ever and ever, because they are done in truth and equity. R.

A Reading from the Second Letter to Timothy

In this reading, Paul bids Timothy to be a faithful worker, reminding himself and others of Jesus' resurrection and the new life that is to be known with him.

Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David—that is my gospel, for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained. Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory. The saying is sure: If we have died with him, we will also live with him; if we endure, we will also reign with him; if we deny him, he will also deny us; if we are faithless, he remains faithful—for he cannot deny himself. Remind them of this, and warn them before God that they are to avoid wrangling over words, which does no good but only ruins those who are listening. Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth.

The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Through north and south and east and west, may God's immortal name be blessed: Alleluia, alleluia! Till ev'rywhere beneath the sun, God's reign begins, God's will is done; Alleluia! (5x)

The Holy Gospel of our Lord, Jesus Christ, according to Luke. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, they called out, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" When he saw them, he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were made clean. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him.

And he was a Samaritan. Then Jesus asked, "Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" Then he said to him, "Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well."


