
A Reading from the Prophet Isaiah

In our Hebrew scripture lesson, the servant of the Lord reflects movingly on his mission – its sorrows and frustrations – and God's high calling and promise to be with him.

Listen to me, O coastlands, pay attention, you peoples from far away! The Lord called me before I was born, while I was in my mother's womb he named me. He made my mouth like a sharp sword, in the shadow of his hand he hid me; he made me a polished arrow, in his quiver he hid me away. He said to me, "You are my servant, Israel, in whom I will be glorified. But I said, "I have labored in vain, I have spent my strength for nothing and vanity; yet surely my cause is with the Lord, and my reward with my God." Now the Lord says, who formed me in the womb to be his servant, to bring Jacob back to him, and that Israel might be gathered to him; now he says, "It is too light a thing that you should be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob and to restore the survivors of Israel; I will give you as a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth. Kings shall see and stand up, princes, and they shall prostrate themselves, because of the Lord, who is faithful, the Holy One of Israel, who has chosen you."

Psalm 40 is a prayer for deliverance and a song of thanksgiving to God who has saved the Lord's servant. The cantor sings the refrain; all repeat, and sing as indicated.



A Reading from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians

In this lesson, Paul greets the members of the new Christian community in Corinth and offers thanksgiving for their growth in Christ.

Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and our brother Sosthenes, to the church of God that is in Corinth, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind—just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you—so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful; by him you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Holy Gospel of our Lord, Jesus Christ, according to John. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

After John the Baptist told his followers about Jesus, the very next day John saw him approaching and said, "There is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. This is he of whom I said, 'After me there comes a man who ranks ahead of me; before I was born, he already was.' I did not know who he was; but the reason why I came, baptizing in water, was that he might be revealed to Israel." John then recounted what happened when Jesus was baptized. "At his baptism, I saw the Spirit come down from heaven like a dove and rest on him. I did not know who he was. God had told me, 'The man on whom you see the Spirit come down and rest is the one you are to baptize with water and the Holy Spirit.' I have seen that happen and have borne witness: this is God's Chosen One."

On the following day, John was standing with two of his disciples when Jesus passed by. John looked at him and said again, "There is the Lamb of God!" When the two heard what he said, they followed Jesus. "What are you looking for?", Jesus said. They replied, "Rabbi, (which means 'Teacher'), where are you staying?" "Come and see", said Jesus. So they went and saw where he was staying, and spent the rest of the day with him, until four in the afternoon. One of the two who followed Jesus was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and say to him, "We have found the Messiah!" (which is Hebrew for 'the Christ'). Andrew brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John; now you will be called Cephas or Peter, which means 'the Rock'".
