THE WORD OF GOD

Blessed be God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. And blessed be God's kingdom, now and forever. Amen.

Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name, through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

O Lord, open our lips. And our mouths shall proclaim your praise.

Praise the Lord. The Lord's Name be praised.

In Psalm 89 the Lord is praised for faithful love and mighty justice. This metrical setting is sung to the hymn tune "Puer Nobis", #124 in the Hymnal.

- 1. From age to age I will proclaim, your faith, forever sing your love; Your faithfulness endures always, your love is set in heaven above.
- 2. "To David I have sworn an oath, made covenant with him alone: 'I will maintain your line always, eternally preserve your throne."
- 3. How blest are those who shout your praise! They walk as always in your light; They glory daily in your Name, rejoice forever in your right.
- 4. You are the glory of their strength; Our might is by your grace restored; Our King is Israel's Holy One; Our ruler, truly, is the Lord.
- 5. All glory to the Father, Son, and to the Holy Spirit be; As from the first it was, is now, and will be for eternity.

The Lord be with you. And also with you. Let us pray.

Almighty God, you have taught us through your Son that love fulfils the law. May we love you with all our heart, all our soul, all our mind, and all our strength, and may we love our neighbor as ourselves; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

A Reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans

This lesson teaches that by the grace of God Christians are no longer slaves to sin but servants of righteousness, bound to the service of God in goodness and holiness.

Paul writes, "Therefore sin must no longer reign in your mortal body, exacting obedience to the body's desires. You must no longer put any part of it at sin's disposal, as an implement for doing wrong. Put yourselves instead at the disposal of God; think of yourselves as raised from death to life, and yield your bodies to God as implements for doing right. Sin shall no longer be your master, for you are no longer under law, but under grace.

What then? Are we to sin, because we are not under law but under grace? Of course not! You know well enough that if you bind yourselves to obey a master, you are slaves of the master you obey; and this is true whether the master is sin and the outcome death, or obedience to God and the outcome righteousness.

Once you were slaves of sin, but now, thank God, you have yielded wholehearted obedience to that pattern of teaching to which you were made subject; emancipated from sin, you have become slaves of righteousness (to use language that suits your human weakness). As you once yielded your bodies to the service of impurity and lawlessness, making for moral anarchy, so now you must yield them to the service of righteousness, making for a holy life.

When you were slaves of sin, you were free from the control of righteousness. And what gain did that bring you? Things that now make you ashamed, for their end is death. But now, freed from the commands of sin and bound to the service of God, you have gains that lead to holiness, and the end is eternal life. For sin pays a wage and the wage is death, but God gives freely, and his gift is eternal life in union with Christ Jesus our Lord.


Offertory Hymn 594, God of Grace and God of Glory, On Thy People Pour Thy Power
