



In 2022 we're looking forward to working with all members to locate St. Michael's alumni; promoting our 75th on our website and outdoor banners (coming soon!); creating a booklet and Powerpoint display with photos and an updated history; and following through with proposed 5-6 fun events.

Mission Engagement

Outreach Team - Pat Dyble, Bill Davenport

Once again in in 2021 we were restricted in our hands-on activities due to the COVID-19 virus. But we were still able to accomplish quite a bit in our efforts to help those in need at home and abroad. In addition to our usual activities with Crossroads, Mariners Inn, the Noah Project, the Church at Crossroads, Habitat for Humanity, Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem, and Episcopal Relief and Development, we once again were able to support Refugee Resettlement through Samaritas by collecting kitchen, bathroom, and bedroom items. Much of what we were able to do was due to the generous support from St. Michael's members.

Thrift Shop - Genny Davenport, Rosemary Berger

Actually the Thrift Shop had a good year, even with Covid-19. Our fiscal year of January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021 made a profit of \$24,699.52 which was given to the ECW. They were able to give \$9,500 to the St. Michael's general fund which was \$2,500 over the \$7,000 in St. Michael's budget. Next year hopefully it will be back to the 14,000.

The Thrift Shop is open 10 hours a week: Friday and Saturday only from 10 AM to 3 PM. On Monday and other days we ticket items, sort through donations, put items where they need to be placed, and also straighten up the Shop. Receiving is open on Fridays 10 AM to 2:00 by appointment. Items not sold or taken to Crossroads, Salvation Army, and Purple Heart each month.

We want to thank all the 30 volunteers who have worked hard and long hours this year to make the Shop a special part of St. Michaels in the community. WE WELCOME MORE VOLUNTEERS!!

Episcopal Church Women; St. Teresa's and St. Elizabeth's Guilds – Elly Garzel

The ECW is open to all women who are parishioners. The Little Thrift shop is our major source of funds to carry forth our projects. We strive to give about half our proceeds to organizations outside our walls. We also helped Donna Lockhart in her studies to become a Deacon. Because of restrictions due to the virus, the ECW had to cancel or postpone many events such as the Sweet Noels cookie sale and The Thrift Shop Fashion show, which we hope to resume in 2022. We welcomed speakers Teresa Wakeen, priest missioner of The Church at Crossroads and Barbara Haug, a parishioner and teacher in Detroit and Grosse Pointe schools. Our guilds meet monthly to worship, study, and socialize. St. Elizabeth's guild raised funds and collected items for donations to Crossroads of Michigan and Mariner's Inn in Detroit. St. Teresa's guild raised funds and donated to The Church at Crossroads, LifeBuilders in Detroit, and Bethune School health kits.

Music - Christian Schoen, organist and choir director

2021 proved to be a very interesting musical year at St. Michael's thanks to COVID-19. Stephanie Dean sang at most of our services throughout the year, with the congregation returning to some singing on Easter Sunday. Our choir resumed rehearsals in November and delivered a very successful and beautiful Christmas Service on December 24, 2021, followed by Lessons & Carols on January 2, 2022. Thanks to the very generous donations from several members of the parish, we were able to fund paid singers for Palm Sunday, Easter, Christmas, and Lessons & Carols, as well as ongoing funding for Stephanie Dean. I am grateful to those who invested in the program in 2021. I would also like to thank the volunteers in our choir who continue to devote their time and talents. Each member of the choir brings unique qualities, which have collectively created a thriving musical environment with fellowship, love, and singing for God's glory.

Adult Formation The Book Group - Elaine Backhurst and Richard Simonds

2021 saw our twelfth year of Book Group at St. Michael's. We consistently have ten to fourteen in attendance, with a core of eight or nine, along with other parishioners who come for any book discussion of interest to them. Book Group is open to everyone; therefore, we try to choose books of varying topics and styles. The books covered this

year: Love Is the Way by Bishop Michael Curry, The Dearly Beloved by Cara Wall, The Day the World Came to Town by Jim Defede, and The Shipping News by E. Annie Proulx.

Vision 75 - Kathie Groschner

The Vision 75 Committee formed to begin the process of discerning the ways in which God is calling St. Michael's to fulfill our mission of loving and serving our neighbors in the world. After prayer, research and discussion we felt that a good starting point would be to respond to the need of many in our community for fellowship. We received a \$1,000.00 grant from the Diocese to begin a monthly program which we titled "Lunch, Laugh and Learn" as an opportunity to gather for lunch and fellowship. The lunch is offered free of charge and is followed by a speaker of interest. The first lunch was in September and continued through December. We hope the COVID rates will be such that we can safely resume in February. Attendance has ranged between 35 and 60, with many of the attendees from outside of our parish community. The cost of the lunches has been met through free will offerings from our guests. Between the seed money provided by the grant and offerings, we have a cash balance. We also hosted a Sunday morning series of open forums to solicit ideas regarding future ministry and direction for St. Michael's. Those ideas will be part of the larger discussion on our future during this 75th anniversary year.

Pastoral Care - Cheryl Mac Donald

The Pastoral Care Committee responds to the pastoral needs of St. Michael's parishioners. The Committee's goal is to help uplift the spirit and is dedicated to the help of those among us that may have a need for help either short term or long term.

Prayer Works!

This committee is part of the Pastoral Care team. Its purpose is to reach out to the homebound among us and offer of prayers to help healing and comfort. A postcard is sent along with a follow-up telephone call from a member to relay the message. They also send out birthday cards, get well cards, sympathy cards, flowers at Christmas and Easter as well as prayer shawls when the occasion arises. The support from the congregation for this group has been overwhelming. Many cards and stamps have been donated to help keep the group supplied with the means to accomplish all that they do.

Eucharistic Visitors

The eucharistic visitors serve communion to the homebound. Once a month a visitation to Cranberry at Shorepointe is made to offer a eucharistic service to members of our Church and others in need of communion.

One of the biggest concerns of the Pastoral Care Committee is to identify the needs of the people that could best be served. Many thanks to all the serve and help the St. Michael's Community.

Memorial Gifts Committee - Kathy Zmyslowski

The Memorial Fund was established at St. Michael's to receive memorials and gifts given by parishioners, their families, and friends. In August of 2006 the Memorials and

Special Gifts Committee was formed to develop guidelines for future gifts. These standards for giving were originally approved by the Vestry in January 2007 and updated in early 2018. The Memorials and Special Gifts Guidelines assist the Memorials and Special Gifts Committee in making recommendations to the Vestry for appropriately funding and recognizing memorials and special gifts at all levels.

The Memorial Fund began in 2021 with a balance of \$53,709.48.

Memorial Gifts: During 2021 memorial gifts were given in memory of Barbara Bangs, Barbara Bertschinger, Suzanne Clogg, Marylou Isenberg, Michelle McCarthy, Geri Richardson, Margaret Rogers, and Robert Sheehy.

Expenditures: The Memorials and Special Gifts Committee approved and recommended to the Vestry the purchase of a digital (electric) piano.
