
THE WORD OF GOD



A Reading From The Prophet Malachi

The prophet foretells that God's messenger will be sent to make ready the Lord's way as the day of judgment approaches.

See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight-- indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.

"Blessed Be The Lord God Of Israel" is our canticle for this morning. The cantor sings the refrain; all repeat, and the refrain is sung again at the conclusion.

Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel; he has come to his people and set them free. He has raised up for us a mighty savior, born of the house of his servant David. Through his holy prophets he promised of old, that he would save us from our enemies, from the hands of all who hate us. He promised to show mercy to our fathers and to remember his holy covenant. This was the oath he swore to our father Abraham, to set us free from the hands of our enemies, free to worship him without fear, holy and righteous in his sight all the days of our life. You, my child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare his way, to give his people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins. In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to quide our feet into the way of peace.

A Reading From Paul's Letter To The Philippians

Paul greets the new disciples in the town of Philippi. He expresses great confidence that the work of grace begun in these new Christians will be brought to fulfillment.

I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart, for all of you share in God's grace with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight to help you to determine what is best, so that in the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.

Hymn 65, Prepare The Way, O Zion, Your Christ Is Drawing Near!

The ringing of the Angelus commemorates Gabriel's visit to Mary and the angels who announced Jesus' birth. The bell is rung three times, and all pray silently, "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among all people, and blessed is your son, Jesus". This is repeated twice more and concludes with nine strokes of the bell.
