First Reading

Genesis 22:1-14

God tested Abraham. He said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." He said, "Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains that I shall show you." So Abraham rose early in the morning, saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and his son Isaac; he cut the wood for the burnt offering, and set out and went to the place in the distance that God had shown him. On the third day Abraham looked up and saw the place far away. Then Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; the boy and I will go over there; we will worship, and then we will come back to you." Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on his son Isaac, and he himself carried the fire and the knife. So the two of them walked on together. Isaac said to

his father Abraham, "Father!" And he said, "Here I am, my son." He said, "The fire and the wood are here, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" Abraham said, "God himself will provide the lamb for a burnt offering, my son." So the two of them walked on together. When they came to the place that God had shown him, Abraham built an altar there and laid the wood in order. He bound his son Isaac, and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. Then Abraham reached out his hand and took the knife to kill his son. But the angel of the LORD called to him from heaven, and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." He said, "Do not lay your hand on the boy or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from me." And Abraham looked up and saw a ram, caught in a thicket by its horns. Abraham went and took the ram and offered it up as a burnt offering instead of his son. So Abraham called that place "The LORD will provide"; as it is said to this day, "On the mount of the LORD it shall be provided."

GOOD NEWS AT ST. MICHAEL'S ... For all the tests of patience and faith, and for all the months of worries and stress, our many hours of problem-solving have led to the extraordinary outcome of transforming a substantial adversity into a real life blessing in disguise. Over this past week, we concluded negotiations on our insurance claim and achieved a financial resolution that will cover every single cost we've incurred in response to the boiler pipe leak, including the installation of the new furnaces. That's right, we have avoided any financial impact whatsoever. And that's only part of the good news. By deciding to install furnaces instead of repairing the broken boiler pipe, we not only devised a lower cost and far less

intrusive remedy to our immediate heating problem, but now have excess boiler capacity which will allow us to avoid the significant cost of buying a new boiler to replace the very old boiler used to heat the church school wing of our building, which has already exceeded its depreciation cycle. In other words, we did more than weather a severe storm together. Rather, we've actually ended up in a better financial and operational condition due to the occurrence of the problem than we were in prior to it happening. That's a rare reward and an inspiring lesson of stewardship for all of us to celebrate. Kudos to Dale Scrace and Grant Gilezan for leading our response efforts over the past 6 months and to the Rev. Marianna and Dave Zmyslowski for their countless hours of participation on our core response team.
